This role is to support people living in the IP33 postcode region in Bury St Edmunds. If you can make any of the dates listed below, we'd love to hear from you.

We need to support 8 people to move from where they currently live on site to another facility on site. This means all their personal belongings, and furniture need to be packed up and moved and the room they are vacating needs a thorough clean before another person moves into it.

1 person we support has requested their new room be painted before they move in.

This all needs to happen between the 29th April and 7th May 2024.

Any volunteers who wish to maintain contact with the people we support through the transition as well as in the future would be welcomed by Mencap.

DBS/References are not required for supporting the move as staff will also be present.

When and where the role is

27th/28th/29th April - Decorating & help person 1 and 2 to pack rooms

30th April - Move person 1 and 2 and help set up new accommodation, clean room for

person 3 and 4, help person 3 and 4 to pack rooms.

May 1st – Move person 3 and 4 and help set up new accommodation

May 2nd – Clean vacant rooms and help person 5 and 6 pack rooms

May 3rd - Move person 5 and 6 and help settle

May 4th - Clean vacant rooms and help person 7 and 8 pack

May 5th - Move person 7 and 8 and help settle


We have an ambitious vision for the UK to be the best place in the world for people with a learning disability to live happy and healthy lives. Volunteers play a key role in helping us achieve this.
