





Classroom & Community Mentor Volunteer – Supported Internship Programme

We are looking for volunteers to support our Supported Internship Programme in Worcester.

We deliver relaxed classroom and community based sessions to young people, aged between 16 and 25, to prepare them for work, and support them to improve their numeracy and literacy skills.

Your role will be to engage with learners in the classroom and to support them to experience work placement environments and try new activities. For example, going for coffee or shopping, alongside learning about safety awareness in the community. Your support will enable the Supported Interns to make informed decisions, and empower them to become independent in and outside of work.

You will support them with the session in the classroom or out in the community, helping to keep them motivated and engaged as well as improving their confidence and independence.

Session run from 10am to 4pm at County House, St Marys Street, Worcester WR1 1HB on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday.
