You will be managed and supported in the role by Jennifer Barfoot.




The job will be based across Pembrokeshire and Ceredigion.



This is a part time job for 16 hours per month.

We will pay £12.20 per hour.



You will live in Pembrokeshire or Ceredigion.

You will travel to meetings around the area and sometimes work at home.

What will the Healthier Me Champion do?



You will work with lots of different people in the local community and at Mencap.

You will build good relationships with people.



You will help to make the local area more accessible for people with a learning disability.



You will listen to Mencap teams, local organisations and people with a learning disability to find out:

- What is important to them.
- The difficulties they face around health.



You will help your manager to run meetings and events. You will help to collect feedback.

You will have a creative, 'can do' attitude.



You will travel to different places in the area.



You will tell people about why it is important to include people with a learning disability in the community.



You will need to be able to travel to different places.

This could be with your manager, using public transport, driving or getting a lift from family and friends.

Other important information



Meetings and events can be on different days and times.

Some of the work will be at set times and some will be during flexible times.



You should have a good understanding of the local area.



You will be willing to learn how to use IT and social media. You will be able to use a smartphone, laptop or tablet.



You should be confident to talk to new people and build relationships with individuals and organisations.

You will always be friendly and helpful.



If you are asked to come for an interview, you will need to bring your ID documents with you. This will include:

- A passport or your birth certificate
- National Insurance number
