- Develop positive relationships with employers and families with the aim of ensuring successful outcomes for the people we support.

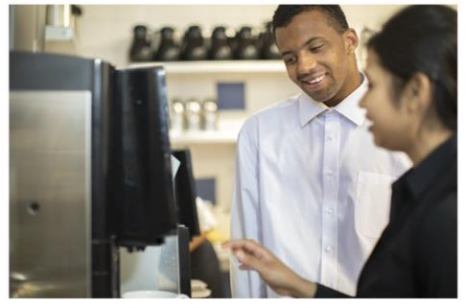

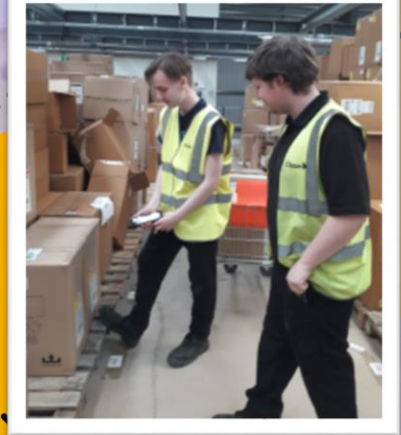
