

Welfare Officer

About the Team and the Role

The Welfare Officer ensures the welfare and pastoral needs of learners on our supported employment programmes are met, leading to improved life outcomes for learners. The role works closely with delivery teams to identify where additional welfare support is required for 'at risk' learners to ensure they have improved wellbeing, attendance and performance and are retained on their programme.

The Welfare Officer supports teams with complex safeguarding or prevent concerns and ensures all statutory requirements are met. The role will develop and lead on the Welfare Strategy, working with colleagues to increase their skills and knowledge in their area.

The Welfare Officer will ensure each learner has access to relevant, timely and accurate welfare information, advice and guidance. The role will ensure appropriately signpost learners to additional specialist services. The role will maintain high quality and accurate records. The Welfare Officer will be required to meet with parents/carers and attend multi-disciplinary meetings as needed to support attendance and any welfare concerns.

What you will bring to the role (Essentials)

 An ability to inspire learners and provide effective engagement and support strategies

- Excellent communication skills and an ability to work effectively with a range of internal and external stakeholders
- · An ability to manage different situations in a sensitive and timely manner
- An ability to work effectively as part of a team
- Creative, flexible and willing to try new ideas
- Well organised and self motivated
- Experience of working with learners with a learning disability, difficulty or autism
- Knowledge of safeguarding and prevent legislation
- Experience of managing complex safeguarding and/or welfare cases
- Knowledge of support employment programmes
- Level 2 English and maths
